Douglas Vanderhorn Architects took this already beautiful 19th century farmhouse in Greenwich and updated, renovated and restored it to the transformation shown here.

Designing the home to maintain its original historic integrity, while bringing its services up to date for the client served as Douglas Vanderhorn's inspiration behind the four-phase, several-year project. Transforming the home, which had been extensively

renovated in the early 20th century, included four phases for the main house, including an addition, plus a reclaimed New York barn rebuilt as a guest house and entertainment space. The addition includes a mudroom, wine room, recreation room and re-designed garage, which is now organically connected to the main house.

Major renovations inside the home were the kitchen and surrounding areas, as well as the master suite and guest areas. Inside, unique finishes include oak countertops and a slate







sink in the pantry, which opens up and brightens the original pantry area. The firm tackled the entire design, including cabinetry and millwork to accommodate the clients' current lifestyle while keeping the integrity of the home intact.

The newly connected garage adds accessibility for the client, and the home's enhanced architectural features to the exterior create enduring character and modern elements without eliminating the home's rich history. Outside and in, Douglas Vanderhorn Architects worked with Cornerstone Builders and decorator Linda Shockley & Associates to transform this historic beauty into a home designed for a family in the 21st century.
